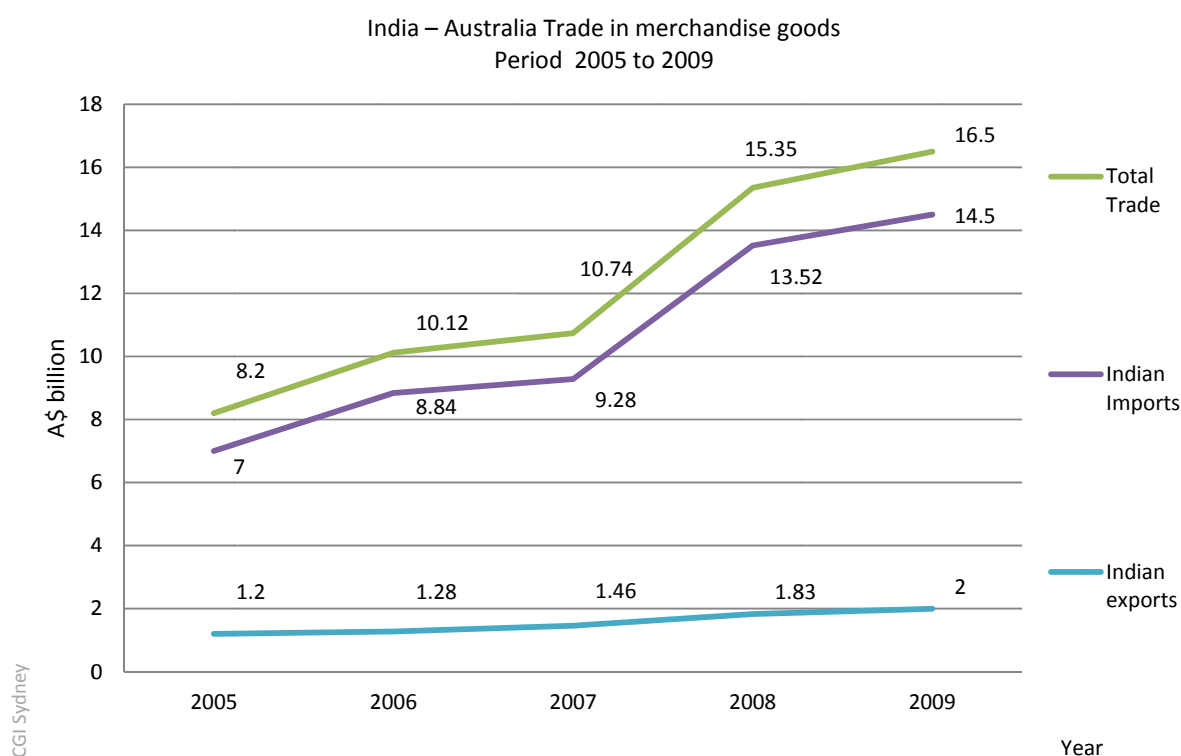


## India Australia Bilateral Merchandise & Services Trade Relations

Calendar year 2009

Bilateral trade between India and Australia for the calendar year 2009 stood at A\$ 16.47 billion, higher by 7.3% over last year 2008. Indian export to Australia for the calendar year 2009 was A\$ 2.0 billion a rise of 10.9 % , over the same period in 2008, while Indian imports from Australia stood at A\$ 14.5 billion a rise of 7.2 % for the same period.

Bilateral merchandise trade between India and Australia has increased by an annual average of around 21 percent over the past five years to 2009. India was ranked **sixth** among Australia's trading partners in 2009. India, as an export market in goods and services for Australia, was ranked **third**. Exports valued at A\$ 18.2 billion.

**India's exports** of merchandise goods to Australia have increased by an annual average of 12.8 percent over the past five years to 2009. India top ten exports represent around 44 % of its overall export to Australia. India ranked **21<sup>st</sup>** as Australia's import source in 2009. India was Australia's **top** source for Rotating electric plant & parts and Pearls and Gems, **2<sup>nd</sup>** for Made-up textile articles & Women's clothing and **3<sup>rd</sup>** for Iron, steel, aluminium structures.

**India's imports from Australia** of merchandise goods increased by an annual average of over 22 percent over the past five years to 2009. India ranked **fourth** among Australia's export destinations in 2009. The main imports included three commodities –non monetary gold, coal and copper ores which accounted for 86 percent, Gold being the dominant import. In 2009 India was Australia's top destination for non monetary gold, **3<sup>rd</sup>** for Coal and Copper ores and **2<sup>nd</sup>** for wool.

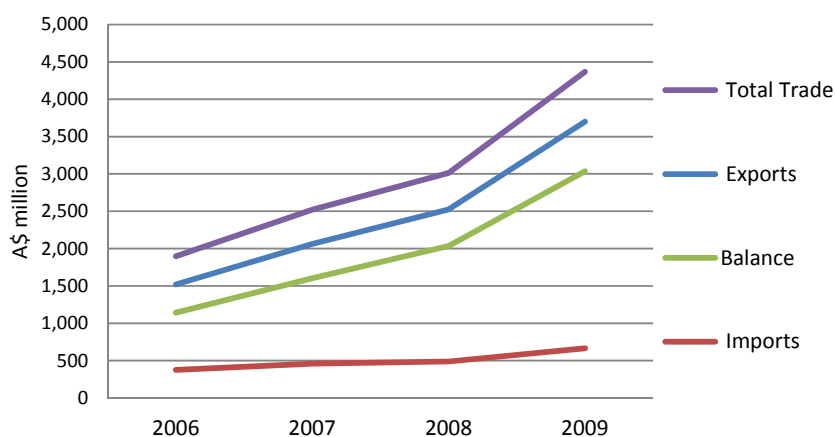

**Total two way trade in Services** between the two countries stood at A\$ 4.37 billion in 2009. Indian imports from Australia were A\$ 3.7 billion and exports to Australia were A\$ 0.67 billion. The major Australian service exports to India were Education – related travel (A\$ 3.2 billion) and personal travel excluding education( A\$ 232 million). The major Australian service imports from India were personal travel excluding education ( A\$ 392 million) and information technology (A\$ 139 million).

India was ranked **sixth** among Australia's trading partners in services ; **4<sup>th</sup>** as a services export destination and **18<sup>th</sup>** as a services import source. While India's services export to Australia fell by 5.7% in 2009, the annual average increase in the last three years to 2009 was 22%.

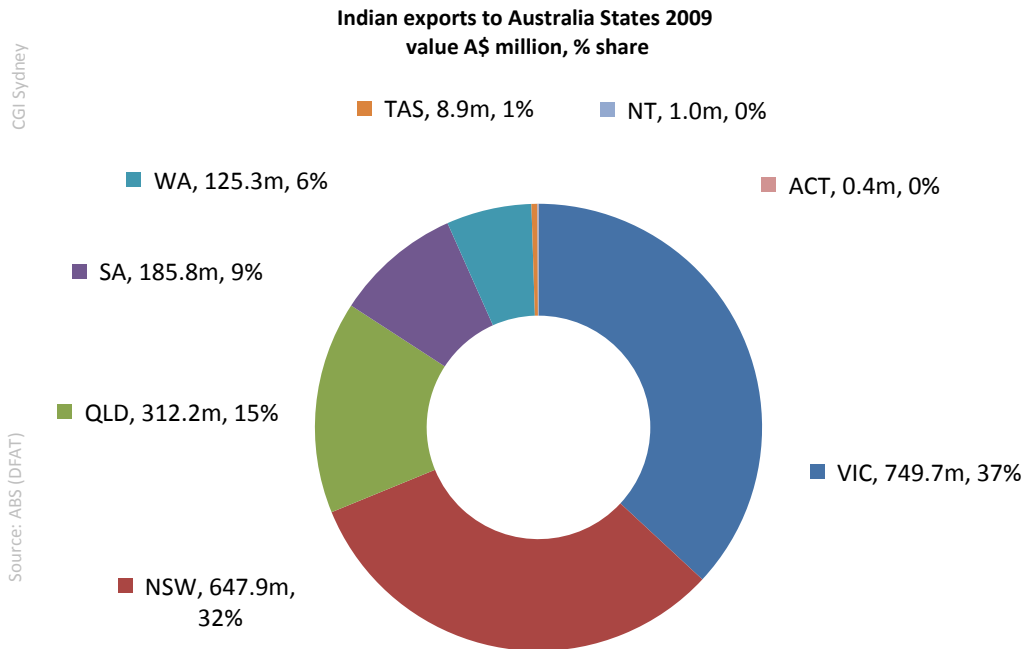
**India Australia bilateral trade in services 2006- 2009**



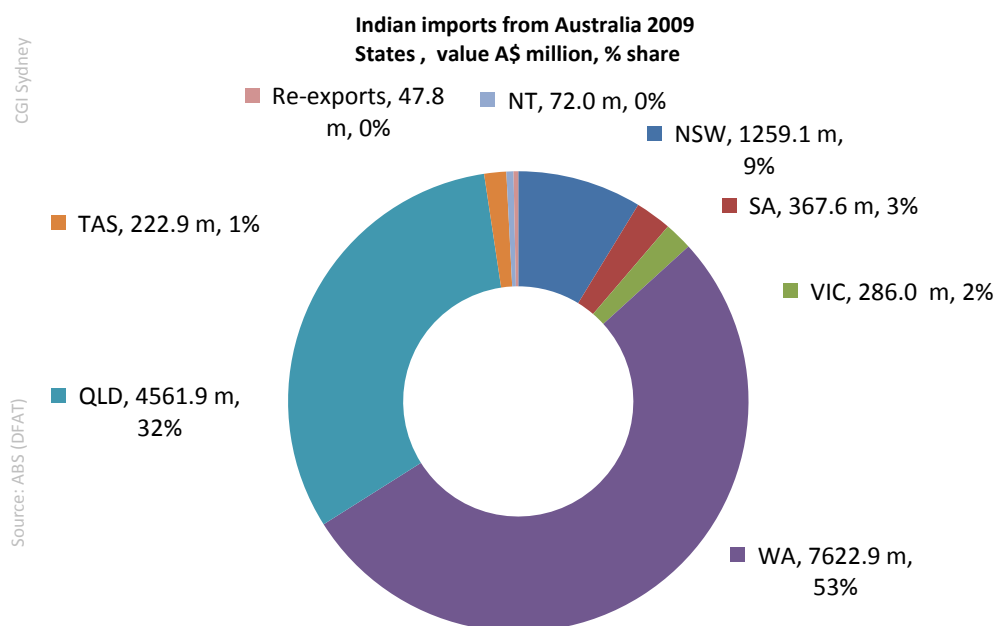

### India's merchandise trade with the States and territories of Australia 2009



In 2009 Victoria was the largest export destination for India and accounted for 37 % of overall Indian exports; followed by New South Wales with 32%; Queensland 15 %; South Australia 9 %; Western Australia 6 %; Tasmania 1% and others.



In 2009 Western Australia was India’s largest import source with imports amounting to 53% of overall Indian imports from Australia; followed by Queensland with 32 %; New South Wales 9%; South Australia 3% , Victoria 2%; Tasmania 1% and Northern Territory.
